Dear Friends,

It starts with a home. Whether it's an address so you can be employed or being able to stay in the same school all year (as Emma's mom tells us in her story) or having a place to cook a healthy meal together - we know that the root of all good things is a sense of place and a sense of home. Yet many families in our community don't have a safe and stable home or are one missed rent payment away from homelessness.

We've long known that the least traumatic, most cost-effective way to prevent homelessness is to keep families in their hard-won homes. A bright side of the pandemic has been the infusion of funding to support this common-sense solution. With federal and state rental assistance, Friends distributed over \$5 million dollars and helped more than 500 families keep their homes. But those funds are limited and will be gone soon and there are many more families that need help.

These remain tough times, but it is important to reflect on the good we have done for so many families in 2022. We all play a part in resolving homelessness. Whether it's through volunteering, donating, making a cause-based career choice, or simply talking through solutions with friends and neighbors, we can all make an impact and spark real change.

This year has revealed so much more about the abundant kindness of so many and our communities are strong together for it. None of this would be possible without your generosity and goodwill and belief that every family deserves a place to call home. We are deeply grateful.

My name is Chanel and this is a chapter in our family's story...

My name is Chanel, and I would like to start this off by saying thank you for letting me share our story. The past few years were a hard and long road for my family. We became homeless when the pandemic hit. Like so many businesses, Vince's work hours were reduced, and eventually, he was out of work. Finding a new job was virtually impossible, everything was closed.

As the days turned into weeks and then months, our money became tighter and tighter. We were heartbroken when we finally had to leave our home. For months, we bounced around from family member to family member. This was especially difficult on our daughter Emma because she is in school, and the instability and transfers started to take a toll on her schoolwork. When our family could no longer help us, we called 2-1-1.

We were placed, TOGETHER as a family, at Friends Associations' Family Center. We were so grateful we could all stay together because we had heard that there was a chance that we might be split apart and stay at different shelters. We finally did not have to worry about where we were going to sleep at night, and we had an entire apartment to ourselves. It was the ordinary things that meant so much to us, having a kitchen to make dinner, falling asleep to the hum of the clothes dryer, and seeing Emma happy.

While we were at the Family Center, we had support and stability. Emma transferred to the local school district and started to really thrive with her consistent routine. As the pandemic eased, Vince went back to work and I picked up more hours at my job. The case managers at Friends worked with us and helped us find an apartment in the same school district, so Emma would not have to transfer again. We are now in the Home-2-Stay program. Emma is thriving in school. Plus, she had a great time this past summer at Friends Association's "Camp Friendship" and she is looking forward to attending it again this summer. I am so grateful that I had the opportunity to work with Friends Association and all the programs they offer.

Partnering with the Courts: Eviction Prevention Court - Chester County

April 2022

In this case study, we highlight how the Eviction Prevention Court in Chester County, Pennsylvania, reduced evictions in communities with high rates of eviction filings. We also detail how the program was created and discuss important considerations for other communities exploring similar court-based eviction prevention programs.

Our EPC Program continues to be the only legal service in Chester County focusing on eviction prevention by assisting residents with legal representation and social services. We are set to expand over the next year. Through the work of EPC, eviction cases are 3x more likely to be withdrawn, and 2.5x more likely to be settled. We have helped save the county & taxpayers over 3.9 million dollars.



Our 200th Anniversary Celebration

2022 marked the 200th anniversary of Friends Association. We honored this milestone with a Family Picnic at the Chester County History Center. Many friends, supporters, community leaders and neighbors turned out to celebrate Friends commitment to our community. The afternoon was filled with stories and relived memories of those involved with Friends over the years.



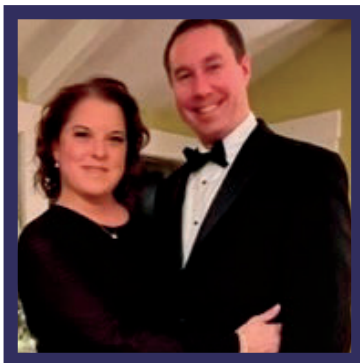
FAMILY CENTER RENNOVATION

Friends Association has been serving Chester County for decades by supporting families that are experiencing homelessness. Our goal is to support them as they regain their footing. For more than a decade, the beloved Family Center in West Chester and its six fully furnished apartments has provided more than 118,000 nights of emergency housing for families experiencing the trauma of homelessness.

The restoration of the aging building was critical in enabling us to continue serving our neighbors in Chester County with dignity for decades to come. With this investment, Friends Association continues to work to ensure that everyone – every individual, family, and child – has a safe, healthy place to call home and the opportunities that come with it.

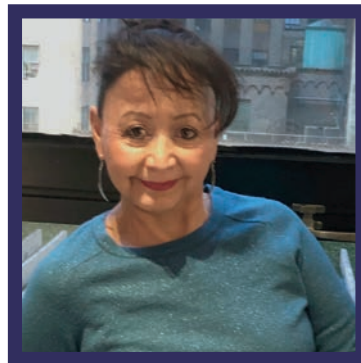

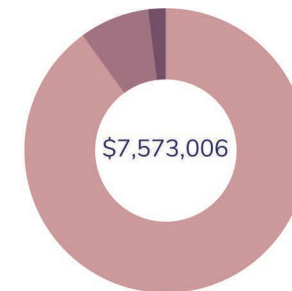
Revenue
