Today, Alicia has stable housing, full-time employment, and owns her own home where she's raising her two children with dignity and hope. Her housewarming wasn't just a celebration, it was a testament to the power of community support and the resilience of the human spirit.

Building for the Future

This past year has been transformative. As you read through this report you will see the impact our programs have had in our fight to end family homelessness and to break the cycle for future generations.

Thanks to our passionate, dedicated team and our supporters, we provided emergency housing for 21 families, strengthened our case management program and expanded our legal services into additional local courts to help with eviction prevention.

Most exciting of all, we began working toward an incredible milestone that will become a reality in early 2026. We are moving our offices to a building that is being renovated to house both office space and family units, **adding 10 additional emergency housing spaces** to serve even more families in crisis.

Every step of our growth has been strategic, focused, and deliberate. We're not just expanding, we're deepening our impact and refining our approach to ensure every family receives the excellence they deserve.

Looking Ahead with Gratitude

As we prepare to welcome more families into our expanded facility and programs, I'm filled with anticipation for the stories yet to be written. Your continued partnership makes all the difference. OUR MISSION

Friends Association prevents homelessness by transforming lives, empowering families, and strengthening our community. We believe everyone deserves a home.

OUR VISION

Friends Association will lead the community in preventing homelessness for families by providing the support they need to become self-sufficient and thrive in a safe, stable home.

OUR STORY

For over 200 years, Friends Association has provided services that focus on the care and protection of children and young people. Over the years, the specific programs have changed to meet the needs of the communities they serve. In the 1980s we opened our first emergency shelter for families facing homelessness with the intent of keeping the whole family together, thereby minimizing the trauma of the situation for children and the adults as well.

Today, Friends Association is so much more than just a family shelter. Through our **Housing First** approach, we help families move swiftly into safe, stabilized homes, sparing them the stress and upheaval of multiple temporary stays. Our work is **Trauma-Informed**, recognizing that poverty and homelessness deeply affect both parents and children. And, with our **2-Generation Solutions**, we walk alongside the whole family, supporting parents and nurturing children to build resilience, restore confidence, and break the cycles of poverty and homelessness for good.

Every interaction, program, and even the design of our Family Center is shaped by compassion and understanding. Those we serve find stability, healing, and hope ... because we believe everyone deserves a home.

PROGRAM STORIES

EVICTON PREVENTION CARE RESOLUTION PROGRAM

Danny came to Friends through our eviction prevention program. She was behind on rent, struggling to find work, and feeling defeated as she tried to make ends meet. She was given just 21 days to leave her current apartment and relocate to someplace new. After less than a week of working with a Friends case manager, Danny quickly showed how goal-driven and proactive she could be when supported and motivated. Today, Danny is working full-time, has received a raise, and remains stably housed. She consistently pays her rent and other bills each month. Watching Danny grow from a vulnerable individual uncertain about where she would live to a person maintaining both housing and job stability has been a true pleasure.

The Eviction Prevention Case Resolution Program is a powerful tool for preventing homelessness and has been recognized by the Pennsylvania Housing Alliance for its effectiveness. Our teams of attorneys, court coordinators, and housing navigators negotiate with landlords, represent tenants at court, provide rental assistance, and where necessary, help tenants locate to new, more affordable housing.

IMPACT

- **291 Households were assisted** through our EPCR program
- **66% of cases had favorable outcomes** for the tenants
- **100% Children stayed with their families** as we assisted with housing solutions

FAMILY CENTER EMERGENCY HOUSING

For pre-teens and teens, moving into a shelter brings not only change but also fears about how their friends will react. That was true for “Anne’s” daughters, ages 11 and 13, when they first arrived at the Family Center. Initially quiet and unsure, both girls have since flourished and gained confidence. They now actively participate in workshops for Family Center residents and help with arts and crafts for younger children. One daughter is involved in the community through basketball and gymnastics, while the other is preparing to take a certified babysitter’s training to start earning money. Their growth has given Anne peace of mind and the space to focus on building long-term housing stability.



The Family Center is the only low-barrier family shelter in Chester County that provides housing for entire families in private apartments. This model allows families to remain together without requiring fathers or adolescent boys to be sheltered separately. In response to identified family needs, we developed new weekly life-skills and education workshops to strengthen independence and support long-term stability. Families residing at the family center work directly with Friends Association case managers to connect with resources, access benefits, and begin the process of securing permanent, stable housing.

IMPACT

- **21 Families were safely housed** together through our Family Center
- **95% Transitioned to stable housing**
- **100% Children stayed with their families** as we assisted with housing solutions

NOTE: In 2026 Friends Association will open an additional Family Center that will provide another 10 units for families in need.



PROGRAM STORIES continued

HOUSING STABILITY CASE MANAGEMENT

Angel and her family were referred to the Housing Stability Case Management team in April of 2025. Angel, a grandmother with custody of her 13-year-old grandson, is unable to work but receives Social Security benefits as her only income. She has battled homelessness for many years and was living in a county-funded hotel when referred to our program. Our team helped her secure a Non-Elderly Disabled (NED) voucher, allowing her to obtain adequate and affordable housing. Angel and her grandson now live in a two-bedroom apartment in her desired location. Our next challenge was furnishing the home. We submitted a referral to Community Warehouse, and soon the new apartment felt complete. Our team continues to support her with life-skills development, budgeting, and short-term goals as she works toward graduating from the program.

The Housing Stability Case Management Program supports families who are currently experiencing homelessness or housing instability. The program continues to grow, offering comprehensive support to all members of a household, including advocacy, education, resource coordination, and life-skills training. Friends Association's HSCM team has expanded collaboration with partner agencies, increasing access to resources and fostering greater independence for families.

IMPACT

- **85 Families received the education and tools they needed** to achieve sustainable housing through our Housing Stability Case Management program
- **100% Remained housed for at least 12 months** while in our program
- **100% Children stayed with their families** as we assisted with housing solutions

JUSTICE IMPACT HOUSING STABILITY CASE MANAGEMENT (NIA)

Jennifer worked with our Justice Impact Case Management program for just over a year. She is a mother of five who faced homelessness after incarceration. Once back in the community, she transitioned to Friends Association's NIA House. While there, Jen found employment, engaged in treatment, and worked toward stable housing and reconnecting with her children. In October of last year, Jen moved out of NIA House into a room-for-rent situation that offered her a six-month lease. During that time, she successfully completed treatment and thrived in her workplace, all while staying closely connected to her children. In July of 2025, Jen secured a two-bedroom unit, where two of her children now live with her full-time. She continues to work full-time, recently received a raise, and was named Employee of the Month. During our final visit, she shared the joy of having all her children spend the night together under her roof as a family.

The Justice-Impacted Housing Stability Case Management (NIA) program supports families who have been affected by the justice system within the past six years and are currently experiencing homelessness or housing instability. The Friends Association team provides housing location assistance, landlord negotiation, rental assistance, and weekly home visits that decrease over time as families stabilize. Case managers also offer resources, referrals, and life skills support while collaborating closely with probation, parole, domestic violence services, and other community partners to promote long-term housing stability.

IMPACT

- **28 families and 54 children were served** in the Justice Impacted-Housing Stability Case Management (NIA) program.
- **86% of the families** located and **maintained stable housing**.

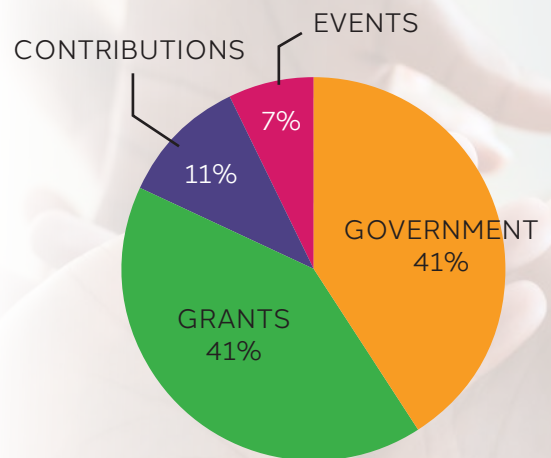
